Dear Representative Delahunt -

We are writing, once again, to urge you to support the impeachment of President Bush and Vice President Cheney. Specifically we are asking that you support the Legislative Committee's passage of H. Res. 799, the Articles of Impeachment of the Vice President of the United States of America. Now that a bipartisan majority of the House floor has sent Representative Kucinich's resolution to the Legislative Committee, swift action is mandated.

The evidence against Bush and Cheney is vast: their lies about Iraqi ties to al Qaeda are on videotape and in writing; their claims about Iraqi weapons have been shown to have been, not mistakes, but lies; their threats to Iran are on videotape; a federal court has ruled this administration's spying on Americans to be a felony; the Supreme Court has ruled Bush and Cheney's system of detentions unconstitutional; torture, openly advocated for by Bush and Cheney, is documented by victims, witnesses, and public photographs; an administration's refusal to comply with subpoenas was found by the House Judiciary Committee on July 27, 1974 as warranting "impeachment and trial, and removal from office." For these and other offenses, no investigation is needed because no better evidence is conceivable.

We believe that Nancy Pelosi's policy of notifying this administration that their impeachable actions will not be pursued is tantamount to giving them a green light to further transgressions of the law. A policy which protects Cheney is not only bad for the nation, it's bad for the Democratic Party.

A majority of the American people want Cheney impeached if he lied our nation into war. The latest Gallup poll found Bush's disapproval rating to be lower than Nixon's was just before his impeachment, and Cheney's popularity with the American people is lower than Bush's.

Finally, we respectfully remind you of your oath to defend the Constitution. If you believe there is substantial evidence that this administration has violated the Constitution, then impeachment is your sworn duty, not a tactic to be weighed for its political feasibility.
